#### Section 4 - First Aid Measures

# **Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures**

**Accidental release:** Minor spills do not normally need any special cleanup measures. In the event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or water courses. Eye/face protective equipment should comprise, as a minimum, protective glasses and, preferably, goggles.
